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Investment Objective and Strategy

The fundamental investment objective of **First Trust Nasdaq Cybersecurity ETF** (the “First Trust ETF”) is to replicate, to the extent possible, the performance of an index of U.S. companies in the cybersecurity industry, initially the Nasdaq CTA Cybersecurity Index™.

The Nasdaq CTA Cybersecurity Index™ is designed to track the performance of companies engaged in the cybersecurity segment of the technology and industrials sectors. It includes companies primarily involved in the building, implementation, and management of security protocols applied to private and public networks, computers, and mobile devices in order to provide protection of the integrity of data and network operations.

Risk

In February 2021, the First Trust AlphaDEX™ U.S. Consumer Discretionary Sector Index ETF changed its investment objectives (see Investment Objective and Strategy) and its name to the First Trust ETF. The First Trust ETF provides exposure to its new index by investing all or substantially all of its assets in an underlying U.S. index fund known as First Trust Nasdaq Cybersecurity ETF (the “Underlying Fund”), which is managed by the First Trust ETF’s portfolio advisor. The effective date of change is February 17, 2021.

The risks associated with an investment in the First Trust ETF is discussed in the First Trust ETF’s most recent prospectus.

Results of Operations

General

The First Trust ETF’s net asset value as of December 31, 2021 was \$32,756,587 or \$39.00 per unit. The First Trust ETF’s net asset value as of December 31, 2020 was \$4,559,184 or \$30.39 per unit.

For the year ended December 31, 2021, the First Trust ETF paid total cash distributions per unit of \$0.0310. In addition, the First Trust ETF declared cash distributions per unit of \$0.3199 for record date of December 31, 2021 with payment date of January 10, 2022.

Investment Performance

For the year ended December 31, 2021, the First Trust ETF returned 29.33% compared to the S&P 500® Index (the “benchmark”) return of 27.61%. Unlike the benchmark, the First Trust ETF’s return is net of fees and expenses.

The First Trust ETF outperformed the benchmark during the reporting period. Prior to the change, the First Trust ETF held primarily Consumer Discretionary stocks which outperformed the benchmark during the initial period. After the change, the First Trust ETF underperformed the benchmark during the period due to stock selection in Information Technology and Industrials. Mitigating underperformance after the conversion was an overweight allocation to Information Technology.

The First Trust ETF’s only holding, the Underlying Fund, held 35 equity securities as of December 31, 2021. The top ten equity holdings for the Underlying Fund accounted for 45.53% of the portfolio within the Underlying Fund.

The Underlying Fund’s top five stocks by contribution to return were Fortinet, Inc., Accenture Plc Class A, Cisco Systems, Inc., Zscaler, Inc., and Cloudflare Inc Class A. The bottom five stocks by contribution to return were Splunk Inc., Mandiant, Inc., Okta, Inc. Class A, SailPoint Technologies Holdings, Inc., and Check Point Software Technologies Ltd.

Recent Developments

In February 2021, the First Trust AlphaDEX™ U.S. Consumer Discretionary Sector Index ETF changed its investment objective to replicate, to the extent possible, the performance of an index of U.S. companies in the cybersecurity industry, the Nasdaq CTA Cybersecurity Index™. 2021 was a banner year for cyber-attacks, most notably the Colonial Pipeline incident in May which led to an almost immediate \$4.4M ransom. Although much of the ransom was

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recovered, infrastructure became a key focus of protection for the remainder of the year as physical assets increasingly become connected through networks. Cybercrime is on the rise as documented attacks against government agencies, hospital networks, corporations, energy companies and others are up. In fact, according to Chainalysis, ransomware payments have risen by 311% in 2020. The acceleration in attacks has partly been made possible by the rise of cryptocurrencies such as Bitcoin. The ability for direct online payments, irrespective of location, and the difficulty in tracing transactions has made cyber ransom attacks particularly attractive. Companies must protect against corporate espionage, loss of client data, unauthorized computer access and much more at a time when more users are remotely connecting to networks outside of the traditional corporate firewall. Cybersecurity solutions must be dynamic as attackers quickly adapt to new solutions. Cloud solutions have been increasingly adopted and a new set of highly scalable businesses built on new security solution sets, such as zero-trust, have emerged and attracted large amounts of corporate spending. While new technology solutions must be protected existing ones also require securing. This has enabled the market for cybersecurity solutions to continue expanding and offers investors securities with generally high growth rates relative to the broader market. In fact, according to Statista, spending on cybersecurity was nearly \$41B in 2019 and is estimated to have eclipsed \$54B in 2021.

Related Party Transactions

FT Portfolios Canada Co. is the Manager of the First Trust ETF and is a Canadian affiliate of First Trust Advisors L.P., the investment advisor (the "Advisor") of the First Trust ETF.

Pursuant to terms of the declaration of trust of the First Trust ETF, the Manager provides or arranges for all management, administrative and other services required by the First Trust ETF. The Manager receives a management fee from the First Trust ETF. For further details, please see "Management Fees".

The Manager has retained the Advisor to provide certain services to the First Trust ETF pursuant to an investment advisory agreement. The Advisor receives advisory fees from the Manager out of the management fee.

(1) Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated year, including the First Trust ETF's proportionate share of the MER of any underlying fund in which the First Trust ETF has invested, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the year.

(2) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the year. This includes the First Trust ETF's proportionate share of the commissions of any underlying fund in which the First Trust ETF has invested.

(3) The First Trust ETF's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the First Trust ETF's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the First Trust ETF buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a First Trust ETF's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading cost payable by the First Trust ETF in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between high turnover rate and the performance of a First Trust ETF.

(4) Effective February 17, 2021, the First Trust ETF is fully invested in the Underlying Fund (See Risk).

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Management Fees

The First Trust ETF will pay the Manager a management fee of 0.15% based on the average daily NAV of the First Trust ETF. The management fee, plus applicable taxes including HST, will be accrued daily and paid monthly in arrears. The Manager may, from time to time in its discretion, waive all or a portion of the management fee charged at any given time.

The First Trust ETF will bear the Underlying Fund's management fee of 0.60% per annum on average daily net assets on the First Trust ETF's portfolio assets invested in the Underlying Fund. Accordingly, the management fee cost to unitholders of their investment will be 0.75% per annum of NAV of the First Trust ETF plus applicable taxes.

Past Performance

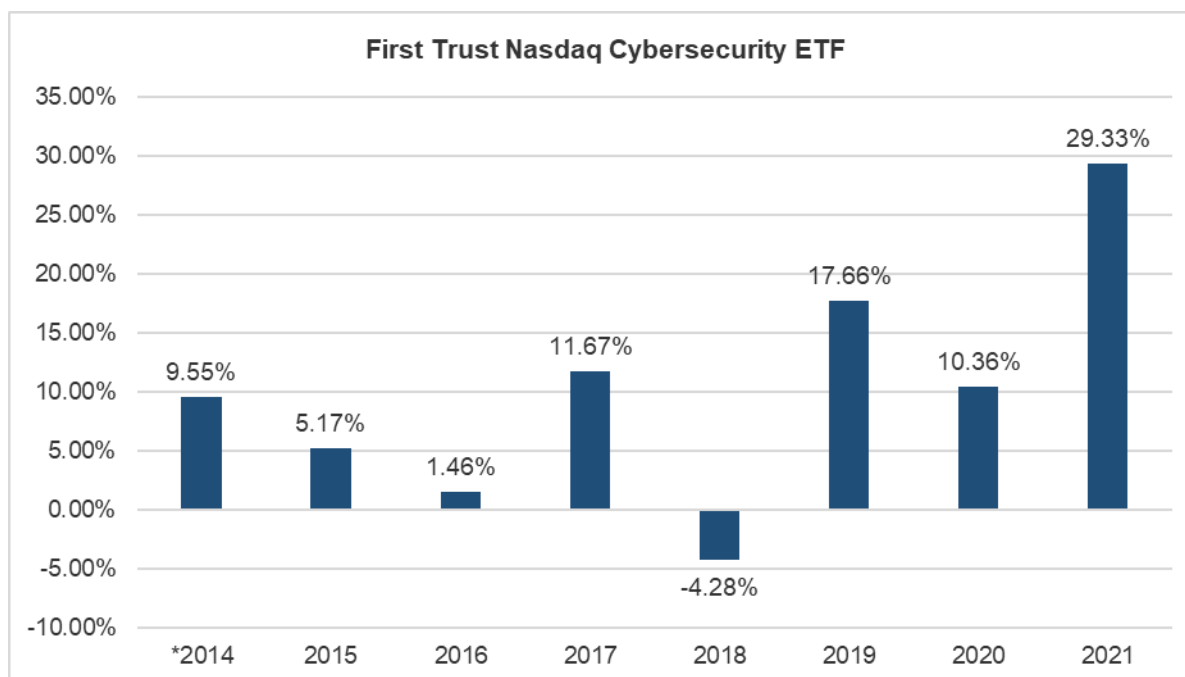
General
